- 1. Through a series of poor decisions, I began drinking as a high schooler and later developed a drug addiction that led me to commit crimes to feed my addiction. However, my final arrest led me to make the best decision of my life. On December 19, 2019 ("Sobriety Date"), I became, and have remained to this date, sober from any mind- or mood- altering substance, including alcohol and illegal and prescription drugs.
- 2. Around my Sobriety Date, I discovered that I was pregnant with my daughter. Until then, I did not understand the weight of the consequences of my actions. I did not understand how much my family missed me and how being involved with drugs endangered others. Since becoming pregnant and raising my daughter as a single mother, I now understand these things and regret the decisions that I made.
- 3. Since becoming sober on December 19, 2019:
- a. I have been a consistent member of Alcoholics Anonymous (AA), regularly attending meetings and maintaining a "home group" that holds me accountable and allows me to be of service to other alcoholics and addicts;
- b. I successfully completed nine months of residential treatment and approximately one year of outpatient treatment with the Prototypes Second Chance Women's Re-Entry Program (see Prototypes completion certificate attached hereto as **Exhibit A**);
- c. I transitioned from interim housing at Prototype to maintaining my own home with the assistance of my Case Manager from the Whole Child (*see* letter of support from LaCresha Scott, ICMS Case Manager at Whole Child, attached hereto as **Exhibit B**);
- d. I completed my high school diploma from Mt. San Antonio College (*see* High School Diploma, attached hereto as **Exhibit C**);
- e. I was granted early probation termination in April of 2023, completed eighteen months of DUI school and had my drivers license fully reinstated.
- f. As a student at Mt. San Antonio College, I completed the Addiction Counseling program while maintaining a 4.0 GPA (*see* Mt. San Antonio College transcript attached hereto as **Exhibit D**), being selected to the President's List (*see* letter of acceptance to the President's List from College President William J. Scroggins, Ph.D. attached hereto as **Exhibit E**) and earning the support of the Program Director (*see* letter of support from the Director of the Addiction Counseling Program, Garett Staley, LCSW, MPA attached hereto as **Exhibit F**).
- g. I completed my addiction counseling internship, was offered part time employment at my internship site, passed a state certification test and am awaiting receipt of my certification as a Registered Addiction Counselor (*see* certification card from Addiction Counselor Certification Board of California attached hereto as **Exhibit G**);
- 4. After completing my associates degree, I intend to transfer to a four year university to continue my studies with the goal of working in health and human services with a focus on harm

reduction for individuals suffering from addiction and mental health conditions. I was awarded with a scholarship to continue my studies (*see* Yen Family Scholarship certificate attached hereto as **Exhibit H**).

- 5. I have taken advantage of every possible resource that has been made available to me knowing from the beginning I was going to need all of the support that I could find. Going back to school has been my saving grace. I have joined amazing programs and my social circle now includes smart, strong, successful and motivated people.
- 6. I am deeply involved in the recovery community not only through my work, but also through the network of sober people that I can call or reach out to for support.
- 7. I am I proud to say that I am a now a responsible single mother living on my own and I have fully embraced being a mother to my daughter. She is a very strong motivator because I want her to have a good life, go to good schools and live in a nice place. Above all, I want to be a good mom and never want her to see me as I used to be.
- 8. Today, I have an incredible, supportive family and strong role models that include mentors, professors and others who have counseled me along my journey that I I can turn to for support.
- 9. Unfortunately, no amount of education will erase my criminal record that will still prevent me from seeking further professional licensure in the counseling field and additional employment opportunities. That is why I am attempting to address these issues now. I would like to be eligible to utilize the degrees and certifications that I am pursuing. I would also like to be eligible to visit jails to utilize my background and serve as an example of what being sober can do. I want to help others get to the same healing place that I have found, but my criminal record limits the ways that I can be of service.
- 10. For these reasons, I respectfully request that the court expunge my convictions so that I can continue to achieve my goals and support my daughter to the best of my ability.
- 11. I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the foregoing is true and correct. Executed on <u>09 / 25 / 2023</u>.
